## **Program Updates**

**Fundraising:** In October, NEO's Adult Ed and New Vistas High School participated in the second restaurant give back night at Panera and raised \$44.32 that will go towards reducing educational barriers.

**NVHS Peer Tutors:** NVHS teacher Angie Kochan has cultivated a cadre of student leaders and peer tutors who are shining in their leadership roles and assuming designated leadership tasks in the classroom.

**Culture Days:** NEO's Adult Education students and staff celebrated the Hispanic Culture this month. Liz Brooks, Bonnie Flint, and Kealey Willman planned and participated in a culture day with students. ELL students researched a Hispanic public figure and presented this research to the group. They also participated in cultural circle dances and crafts.







**BSU Office of Charter Schools:** Two representatives from Ball State's Office of Charter Schools were onsite at New Vistas on October 14 and 15 for focus group conversations and classroom visits. We had good community representation for the Monday meeting and participation from students, teachers, staff, and

administrators for the focus group. The team noted the excellent instruction happening in the classrooms and very positive feedback from all. **WAY TO GO NVHS TEAM!** 

## Marketing and Recruiting Initiatives

Here is a summary of some of our recruitment initiatives for the month of October.

**Adopt A Place:** To date, 13 NEO Ambassadors (staff and board) have adopted over 50 places in service area; we are in the process of getting our material out to these places and establishing relationships with these key contact people at these places. *It does indeed take a village*.

**Community Partnerships:** Adrienne and Rebecca met with former NEO HSE graduate Jeni Bolton about building our referral and training partnership with McDonalds. This is an exciting work in progress.

**Community Events:** NEO's dedicated team volunteered at three community events in October to get the word out about our programs.

- Lake Station Trick or Treat at Riverside Park: Adult Ed teacher, Jim Pavelka set up the Halloween backdrop and Adult Ed Director, Adrienne Carrol along with her husband Jack, distributed goodies and NEO information to over 800 people who attended this event. Lots of connections were made!
- **Mobile Food Mart at NEO:** The NWI Food Bank held another Mobile Food Mart at NEO this month for about 200 families. Many thanks to Dave, Laura Jackson, Shelley Schmidt, Scott Cvelbar, Jim Pavelka, and Anita King for lending a hand.

#### Facility Updates

**Creekside:** Construction work is finished and NEO has the Certificate of Occupancy! Angie Scott, owner of Creekside, will be leading the charge now to set up the rooms, hire and train staff, and get final licensing. She hopes to be operating by January.

#### Financial Update

Audit: Auditors were onsite in October. They plan to have final reports completed by mid-November.

**Lake Station Referendum:** The Lake Station property tax referendum passed; this means that New Vistas will receive a proportionate share for the student we serve from Lake Station.

**Rising Up Campaign**: Amount raised to date is \$1,640,000, not including Creekside owner contributions. November will focus on outreach to existing and past donors through direct mail and online newsletter to our greater mailing list. We are asking all NEO team members to share/forward the newsletter to those in their personal network with a personal comment inviting their support.
